

# All-American Road and National Scenic Byway




Most of the Great River Road is designated as a National Scenic Byway by the Federal Highway Administration and is promoted nationally and internationally as one of America's greatest drives.

In addition, 8 of the 10 states - including Minnesota - have received All-American Road status for the Great River Road.




Great River Road Visitor Survey Results Overview



of respondents were aware they were traveling on the Great River Road Most respondents were traveling by car and 20% were traveling by bicycle



25 percent of respondents were over the age of 50



27 percent were under 18



75% of respondents visited or plan to visit the Headwaters of the Mississippi River The top three activities in terms of enjoyment included:

- 1 Touring by car
- 2 Headwaters/ Itasca State Park
- 3 Hiking



75% of respondents were visiting friends and family or were vacationing


Many respondents would like to see more and better signs indicating they are on the Great River Road

of respondents definitely will or probably would plan to visit again Most travelers learned about the Great River Road from:



## Plan Your Trip Resource Categories

10-State Interpretive Center: 12
Minnesota interpretive centers that are part of a ten-state network of places to learn specifically about the Mississippi River's landscape, history and art

1 Information Center/Rest Area: state and local traveler information centers, rest areas

Native American Culture: sites featuring Native American historical and contemporary culture

Get On The Water: boat landings, river bridges, fishing piers

History: history museums, historic sites, interpretive markers

Arts and Culture: outdoor art, art museums and performance art

Scenic Overlook: places to enjoy Mississippi River views

Other Gems: Other places to see and do

Park Forest Wildlife Area: local, state and Federal parks, forests, wildlife refuges/areas

MN Grown Members: farmers markets, CSA farms, garden centers, wineries, fruit & vegetable growers, pick-your-own farms, livestock producers, meat processors, Christmas tree growers, and producers gourmet products like honey, wild rice, and cheese – within ten miles of the Great River Road

☑ Electric Vehicle Charging Stations: To improve travel confidence, electric vehicle charging station maps, such as Alternative Fuels Data Center, can identify charging stations to, from and along the Great River Road

Amtrak Stations: Amtrak stations in Minnesota

Excursion Boat Landings: overnight Mississippi River excursion boat landings

MN Public Airports: commercial service, general aviation, and seaplane base airports

Great River Road: 565 miles of Minnesota Mississippi River exploration! Follow the green and white "Pilot's Wheel" guide signs at each turn.

Mississippi River Trail: Bicycle route, often on the Great River Road shoulder, sometimes trails or local roads.

Other Minnesota Byways: alignments of Minnesota's 20 other state and National scenic byways, each offering its own special sense of place. Click on a byway alignment to see its unique byway guide sign and a link to its website.

Tribal Reservation/Trust
Lands: Minnesota is home to 11
reservations and 12 federally recognized sovereign tribal nations. Each tribe is a separate sovereign nation — unique unto itself and distinct from all other federally recognized tribes.

## Plan Your Trip Updates

- The more than 700 sites in the online resource inventory need to be confirmed and updated.
- Our Commission Agencies (DNR, MNHS, MnDOT) account for about a third and we are working individually with those agencies.
- We will need Ambassador help to update site information, improve photos, and suggest new sites.
- The process for ongoing updates is in development.
